October 2022 Meeting

Our October meeting brought back the teaching table, hurray! David Barrett led the first of, I hope, many teaching tables. He impressed us with locator cards, a 4-ace effect, as well as many moves and different ways to do a double lift. These are always useful. It was a great teaching table that led into a great lecture.

Glenn Morphew was our lecturer in this the month of October. He started with some card effects. He too did 4-ace effects. He also performed an effect where a signed card was found by a drawn-on baby. He performed an illusion with a Houdini card going into a plastic bag with the other 51 cards as guards and the Houdini card escaped. But he didn't just do effects with cards. He had dice, money, an impressive shell game and an awe-inspiring ring on rope routine.

One other card effect, that he had performed on Fool Us, was shown and explained. With six cards, five disappeared and reappeared elsewhere, but the sixth card disappeared for good.

It was a great lecture with great take home toys that I am eager to learn.

<u>WonderPhil</u> is a full-time professional magician, performing hundreds of shows each year for kids, family, and adult audiences.

His original magic has been published in Vanish Magazine, and The Linking Ring, and his Birthday Candle Repeat was recently released by Amaze Kids & Vanishing Inc.

In this lecture, Phil will teach magic from both his kids' show and corporate show repertoire, with magic that's great for closeup, parlour, and stage.

You can expect a lot of fun kids and family magic tricks and tips, and routines with props ranging from from paint brushes to cards.

Phil will also teach his fingertips coin vanish, and will show several ways that a simple elastic band can add dimension, and a new layer of deception to even the most basic coin sleights. He'll explore a different take on Bank Night, and a way to end The Professor's Nightmare with an extremely fair false count and a climax that puts the ropes in the spectator's hands.
